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Why is Farmland Preservation Necessary?

- Slow/Reverse recent trends in agriculture's economic impact
 - 2012-2017 = 14% decline in value of production
- Address declines in worked farmland nationally & at state level
 - Locally, declines have been minimal
- Continuity Similar plans have been in place since 1980.
- Allows landowners to qualify for income tax credits.
- Maintains familiar landscapes and communities (i.e. rural heritage).



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Farmland Preservation Goal

• Provide appropriate conditions for commercial agricultural by identifying and preserving a sufficient land, infrastructure, and economic base to support agriculture.

- Preserve the rural character of large areas of La Crosse County
 - Utilize farmland preservation tools encouraging landowners to preserve their farms.
 - Encourage landowners to cooperate to preserve contiguous tracts.
 - Utilize zoning and sub-division ordinances to protect areas planned for agriculture.
- Preserve a strong agricultural economy
 - Promote educational tools to encourage "Buy Local" programs.
 - Provide incentives to promote value added agriculture.
 - Maintain Use Value Assessment.

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• Promote home based businesses in agricultural areas.

- Preserve a healthy natural environment.
 - Provide additional funding and technical assistance for conservation practices.
 - Promote the preservation of open space, and agricultural land adjacent to important resources.
 - Promote sustainable agriculture, organic practices and local food supply planning.
- Promote a strong balance of landowner rights and community benefit.
 - Ensure that public participation is encouraged and utilized in drafting plans.
 - Promote open and transparent government.
 - Policy must be made while respecting landowner comments.
 - Recognize that the interconnectedness of natural systems requires collective action to achieve outcomes.

Foster effective, cooperative government units.

- Include all levels of local government in decisions.
- Respect the activities of local governments.

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- Build open, honest and supportive relationships between government units.
- Collaborate, cooperate and compromise.
- Support agriculturally related businesses.
 - Promote Agricultural Enterprise Areas
 - Educate the public on the benefits of local agri-business
 - Support agri-business with technical assistance and revolving loan funds.
 - Include agriculture in Economic development discussions.
- Promote Aesthetic Beauty and Bluffland Preservation
 - Support public/ private partnerships which promote bluffland preservation.
 - Promote an active recreational use of preserved blufflands.

- Respect local comprehensive plans and encourage development that is consistent with those plans.
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- Ensure that the Farmland Preservation Plan and comprehensive plans are consistent.
- Promote development with density bonuses and streamlined approval processes in areas planned for development.
