Specialized Housing – 2025 Activity (Housing and wraparound supports <u>for everyone</u>)

- 1. Ten apartments become available at Hillview (24/7 presence)
- 2. Thirteen apartments become available at "The Collective" (coordinated support)
- 3. Launch of New Housing Partnerships:
 - Couleecap (estimated 12-16 apartments)
 - Karuna (12 beds) 24/7 presence
- 4. Release of Specialized Housing Plan
 - Housing partnerships & financing to fulfill remainder of capacity needs

Pathways to Housing List—Population Characterization Housing:

99%

Single Adult	87%

87% are single adults

Level of support/case management required:

No Case Management	1%
Light Case Management (Monthly Check-Ins)	15%
Moderate Case Management (Several Times Per Week)	45%
Intensive Case Management (Daily Support)	32%
24/7 Onsite Staffing (Residential or Hospital Settings)	7%

Other Considerations:

Need subsidized rent

Have transportation

Have a disability

Have pets

77% need moderate to intensive case mgt

1/3 have a disability

99% need subsidized rent

Currently only half of the P2H list has an identified case manager or housing navigator
